The Autism Awareness Care and Training Centre (AACT), is a local support and education centre for children with autism that was founded in 1998 by Mrs. Serwah Quaynor, a mother of a child with autism. In search of services to help her child, Mrs. Quaynor made a personal commitment to help other Ghanaian children with autism. Mrs. Quaynor fulfilled her commitment by creating AACT seven years ago. Since creating the Centre, Mrs. Quaynor has worked tirelessly to help parents of children with autism in Ghana to understand better the disability and to feel that there is a safe place to go for support and help.

AACT's mission is to support the families of children with autism. In order to achieve this mission, AACT focuses on two primary areas: 1) promoting awareness and understanding of autism in Ghana ; and 2) providing training and educational services to children with autism in order for them to function more effectively in society.

While developing countries understand autism as a medical disorder, the general public in Ghana have little or no understanding of autism. Given this "gap", families of children with autism are often left ostracized from their communities and extended families. In some cases, the mothers of children with autism are seen as "witches" that have possessed their child with evil spirits. For these reasons, having a child with autism in Ghana is a traumatic and painful experience for most families.

Autism Awareness Care & Training (AACT) was formed to help children with autism and their families in Ghana to better understand the disorder and to feel that there is a safe place to go for support and help. Today the organization not only supports the parents and families but it also has become a centre for these children to receive quality education.

Some of their work includes:

- Daily care and education for children with autism
- Public awareness campaigns with newspapers, national TV and radio to discuss autism, what it is and what it isn't to reduce the social stigma around the disease
- Educational approaches to teaching language and communication
- Life-Skills training
- Sensory integration therapy
- Training of caregivers, parents, family members, attendants and professionals.
- Art & Music therapy
- Field trips and extracurricular activities
- Respite care for families

The centre is looking for students to assist with the running of the centre and with the educational and social development of pupils.

The role will include some or all of the following:

- Provide support for individual students inside and outside the classroom to enable them to fully participate in activities
- Assist class teachers with maintaining student records.
- Help with the day-to-day running of the centre
- Assist with fundraising efforts
- Provide one-on-one attention to the children at the centre.
- Support the aims and ethos of the school to provide quality education for all students.
- Attend team and staff meetings
- Be proactive in matters relating to health and safety

Where is the placement based?

The placement is based at the Autism Centre in Accra. It is roughly a 5 to 10 minute journey to and from the Ikando Volunteer Accommodation in the centre of town. The volunteer must be aware that the working environment will be basic and resources will be limited.
